

ITS GETTING THERE.....

This will be the third year that I have been running the water and many of you will have witnessed the significant changes in the appearance of the venue and the increase in fish stocks.

FISH STOCKS

The fish stocks in the first year were increased by adding a selection of perch, rudd and roach (some up to 10" long). Last year I added bream , tench and crucian carp and this coming season I hope to get some more larger roach and crucians.

THE SWIMS

All of the swims on the front lake are fronted with railway sleepers for safety and to prevent bankside erosion, paving slabs have been dug in for comfort and in addition to this, most of the swims are now provided with hand rails and proper steps to aid access and safety.

ACCESS

The access tracks and pathways around the lake have been cleared to give vehicular access around the back lake, however there have been occasions when access around the lake has been prevented by members blocking the tracks & paths with their vehicles, brollies, bivies and tackle. Therefore it is now mandatory that the track & pathways be kept clear at all times and that cars are parked in designated car parking areas only.

Remember that driving to the rear lake is only allowed in the **DRY SUMMER MONTHS ONLY**

FISH WELFARE

Several fish were caught last year with mouth damage probably caused by fish getting stuck in the reeds etc. To reduce this the reeds have been poisoned and cut back. Extreme caution must be taken when fishing close to reeds or snags and a new rule introduced restricting anglers to only casting no further than halfway across the lake. Another risk to fish safety is members wandering away from their rods whilst fishing, this is not only dangerous for the fish but against the law. Therefore anglers must not be more than 3 metres of their rods.

SUBTLE REMINDER

The club is primarily for adults, where children are permitted (and encouraged) provided that they behave in a quite manner and do not disturb other anglers. Enough said on that matter.....
